
## With a Shepherd's Care

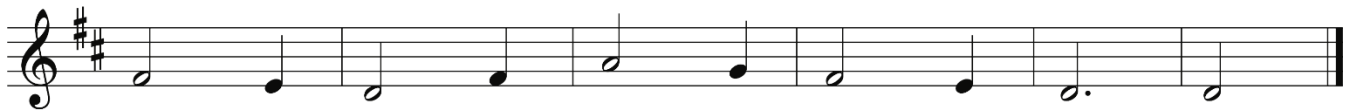
# The King of Love My Shepherd Is
